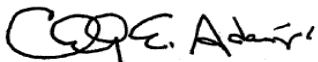

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order/Roll Call

Mr. Willis called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. Supervisors Grillo, Kempf, Vanderhyden and Kove were present. Supervisor DiTommaso attended via telephone/Zoom.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Chairman's Opening Comments

39 Mr. Kove thanked everyone for attending the meeting. The following items were
40 discussed:

41 ➤ Florida Power & Light (FPL) removed the lights on Bonita Beach Road and the poles in
42 front of the fire station. Completion of the project by the end of the month is anticipated.

43 ➤ Regarding a loose reflector at the entrance of the community, Mr. Willis stated he will
44 have it replaced.

45 ➤ Mr. Kove asked Mr. Willis address a resident's report of an exposed drainage pipe at
46 28075 Wicklow Court.

47 ➤ Regarding the tree in the lake between the 4th green and the fifth T-box, Mr. Willis
48 informed the HOA that the dead Cypress tree was removed last week. He determined other
49 Cypress trees in the community are not dead; rather, they are in the winter stage.

50 ➤ Regarding solar lighting, Mr. Willis stated that AV-Tech placed the equipment order and
51 is researching if it needs a permit. Once completed, a proposal will be presented and, if
52 approved, he expects installation to be completed within a few months.

53 ➤ Regarding speed hump installation, Mr. Willis stated that he will schedule the project
54 once the permit is issued.

55 Placement of the crosswalk was discussed.

56 Mr. Kove asked Mr. Willis to coordinate the project schedule with Ms. Weber-Brunson
57 and Troon Management.

58 Resident Denise Germano reiterated an email request to Mr. Adams for a copy of the
59 survey delineating Coach Homes IV and CDD property and for the Arborists certification on tree
60 selection, to address her and other residents' concerns about the tree roots from the ponds
61 damaging irrigation and property. Mr. Kove stated that Mr. Adams will send her the survey.
62 Mr. Kove will advise her on the other matter, once he speaks to Mr. Adams. Mr. Willis noted
63 that the State established the littoral zone and plant selection and approved the permit for the
64 CDD, not Lennar.

65 ➤ Regarding algae maintenance, Mr. Nott, of SWS, reported on the progress of dying Lake
66 14 and upcoming plans to dye Lake 8; crews will be on site to hand cut various lakes this week.

67 Mr. Willis defined the littoral zones and the various purposes and benefits of littorals.
68 Mr. Kove asked Mr. Willis to include Mr. Nott in the next littoral planting project and to prepare
69 a diagram of each lake for the Board to review.

70 Discussion ensued regarding the location and selection of plants and/or littorals,
71 aesthetics of littorals, upcoming quarterly maintenance project and the compressor box
72 location for the driving range lake.

73 ➤ Regarding the crosswalk and stop sign lines repainting project, Mr. Willis stated that
74 Collier Paving plans to paint and complete the speed hump paving project concurrently. Mr.
75 Kove asked Mr. Willis to email the schedule to Ms. Weber-Brunson so she can notify residents.

77 **THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Public Comments (3 minutes per speaker)

79 Mr. Willis stated 11 residents are attending via Zoom.

80 No members of the public spoke.

89 **C. Respondent: Johnson Engineering, Inc.**

90 Mr. Willis noted that Johnson Engineering, Inc. (JEI) is the sole respondent to the RFQ
91 for Engineering Services. He and Mr. Adams work with JEI in other CDD's and deem JEI fully
92 qualified to meet the District's engineering needs.

93 **D. Competitive Selection Criteria/Ranking**

94 Mr. Willis advised that, with only one respondent, this step is no longer necessary. The
95 Board, upon review, can award the contract to JEI.

96 Mr. Urbancic reviewed the award process to rank Johnson Engineering as the #1 ranked
97 respondent and to authorize Staff to negotiate a contract.

98 Mr. Kove noted that JEI received “rave” references from two other communities and
99 Mr. Adams. He supports awarding the contract to JEI.

100 **E. Award of Contract**

102 **On MOTION by Mr. Kove and seconded by Mr. Grillo, with all in favor, deeming**
103 **Johnson Engineering, Inc., as the #1 ranked respondent to the RFQ for**
104 **Engineering Services and to award the Engineering Services contract to**
105 **Johnson Engineering, Inc., and authorizing Staff to commence negotiations,**
106 **was approved.**

109 Mr. Kove stated that Banks Engineering’s services will terminate once they complete the
110 speed hump project.

111

112 **FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

114 **A. Beach Road/Sidewalk Lighting Project**

115 Regarding Phase 3, Mr. Willis stated that Mr. Adams is in contact with FPL daily and is
116 awaiting a response; an update will be emailed to the Board. Mr. Kove asked Mr. Urbanic to
117 keep track of the approaching deadline, as it might be necessary to send a letter to FPL.

118 **B. Drain Pipe Repairs**

119 Mr. Willis stated that he will notify Mr. Grillo when MRI plans to be on site to repair the
120 broken pipe. MRI is waiting for the materials to arrive, which are expected within the next few
121 weeks.

148 **A. District Counsel: Coleman, Yovanovich & Koester, P.A.**

149 Mr. Urbancic gave an update on the new ethics continuing education requirement and
150 discussed Board Members completing an ethics training course in 2024. He will continue
151 monitoring the Commission on Ethics’ website and provide updates. Ms. Kempf asked Mr.
152 Urbancic to research if he can conduct the ethics training course for the Board.

153 **B. District Engineer: Banks Engineering, Inc.**

154 Mr. Underhill stated that the Limited Development Order (LDO) permit applications for
155 the speed tables and the three-way stop sign additions were filed with the City early last week.
156 Construction funds will be used for the speed hump, pedestrian crosswalk and solar lighting
157 projects. Regarding placement of the speed humps, he recommended all parties meet on site
158 with the contractor.

170 completed projects. The consensus was to remove completed projects from the Report every

171 quarter, meaning three months after the completion date.

- Irrigation station near Bonita Landing – clusia installed to improve aesthetics
- Pine straw to be installed along BBRD in December

- Grub infestation is being addressed along BBRD
- Lake 14 to be dyed in order to treat the planktonic algae, continues to improve and staff will continue to monitor.



